

FRIENDS OF DEAL ISLAND







A grant from the Foundation of National Parks and Wildlife enabled us to fund our December 2019 working bee.

The weeding team selected included a couple of experienced Tasmanian regulars from previous work on the island, another who was last at a working be in 2008 and 3 newcomers a Tasmanian and a Victorian couple..

Over the 10 days we worked on most of the weed sites on the island. Sea spurge was searched out and pulled from Garden Cove, Winter Cove and East Cove. Checked for a few other spots on the islands 20 km foreshore

fortunately with no spurge found. Ragwort is our biggest challenge with about 10 sites in the islands tussock grasslands. Ragwort flea beetle a biological control agent, was introduced a few years ago unfortunately no significant evidence of its activity has been found.

We spent many hours digging and pulling ragwort rosettes from 10 sites ranging from 20 ha to a few square metres. Other weeds present on the island include Arum Lily, Horehound, two species of Mullein and three species of thistle, these were all removed when found. All sites were mapped and recorded. Sites of the two species we believe we had eradicated were carefully checked - Marron

grass at winter Cove and Cumbungi at Winter Cove creek.



A great working bee, everyone working well together on some prickly, some deep rooted and some tiny hard to spot weeds. There were a few wet days and plenty of wild windy days. We had great meals prepared by a roster of great cooks. Caretakers Diane and David were great neighbours and it was a pleasure working with them and sharing meals.



It was fantastic to see the works that have been completed on the island up close and personal. The houses with their new roof's are looking great and the lighthouse looks amazing! Minor painting and restoration to be completed within the next few months will bring these works to a close. Well done to Parks & Wildlife Tas and all involved.

Our AGM is planned for Sunday 24th May with a general meeting to follow. Love to see another great turnout, details to be advised closer to the date.




Working Bee Expression of interest
