Feral Oyster Removal 6.30a.m. Sunday 24th May

Here's your opportunity to have a last crack at the feral oysters for this Summer/Autumn. Yes, that was summer. Our objective for the final oyster removal for the season is to clear the foreshore up to the large gum tree (you know the one). A registration desk will be set up at 6.15a.m and it is essential that participants register and read the safety guidelines. If you can bring a cold chisel, hammers, tomahawks or other suitable tools as well as safety goggles that would be great. Gloves will be available if required. Solid, enclosed footwear is required and appropriate sun protection recommended.

Latest news on the proposed 5 year plan

Following input from residents concerned about increased and inappropriate vehicle use of the NE end of the point we have put the submission to Crown Land Services on hold. We will discuss the issues with CLS and promote our project to consider, design and install appropriate signage. As with all projects we undertake this will include wide stakeholder consultation before implementation. Further views are welcome, in fact encouraged.
